From our President/CEO

Dear Selah Freedom Supporters,

I am once again proud and humbled by all that we have accomplished together this past year! The number of women served has more than doubled, even tripled in some areas, and our services have expanded from local to statewide to national. I am most thrilled to share that a solid 75% of the survivors who graduate from our program not only do not return to the streets, but are attending college or firmly set on their career paths. This is beautiful, as each women we have served is a special, uniquely gifted individual, who brings so much to her surroundings. The college campuses are blessed to have them, as they are greatly enriching their communities and finally feeling they belong!

We have celebrated survivors taking the witness stand and speaking with confidence to convict their traffickers/abusers. I had the privilege of watching one of our girls share her story with such poise and fortitude that the judge ruled overwhelmingly in her favor, convicting her abuser to two concurrent 50-year sentences. Justice is being served, voices are being heard and the tide is turning. Selah Freedom has a strong, professional, dedicated staff that fights relentlessly for these girls. I could not be more proud.

Without our community partnerships our work would be impossible. Our outcomes and success are due to partnering with the many not-for-profits that fight for these young lives, law enforcement, state's attorneys, legislators and our Attorney General and Governor. They have opened doors and all played a key role in positioning us for success - not just sustainability but outcomes that are saving lives and the state a great deal of money. I look forward to the next 12 months when three more safe houses will open - over 20 more bedrooms to shelter broken lives. We are also working with PACE Center for Girls to take our prevention program statewide. We are honored to be chosen as the organization in our region to not only partner with the acclaimed Boston based program, "My Life, My Choice", but to become our region's only local Training Hub.

The Midwest is flourishing, Florida is experiencing unprecedented success, lives are being restored and abuse is being prevented. I hope you will continue to support our efforts as we lead this movement. I want to acknowledge one of our generous stakeholders, whose belief in Selah Freedom has given us the foundation to launch and grow into the strong force we are today. PROGRAMS



"Before going through "My Life, My Choice," I never realized what a pimp really looks like. I thought it was the guy with gold teeth and a fur jacket. Now I realize I've actually known pimps and I've seen my friends get used by guys like that." -Sarah, Age 14

Our Prevention Program, "My Life, My Choice", has a 90% success rate with preventing teen girls from being commercially sold. Through survivor and clinical facilitators.

Selah Freedom equips young women with the tools they need to protect themselves from traffickers and teaches them to recognize the red flags, tactics and language of a pimp.

98 teen girls completed Prevention Groups.

Outreach

Selah Freedom's Outreach Program is multi-faceted and serves the highest volume of survivors in our community. We partner with and train law enforcement, lead sex trade support groups to women coming out of "the life," and provide case management and lifesaving resources to survivors.

We are now traveling around the country training law enforcement and legislators on TYLA (Turn Your Life Around), a prostitution diversion program created in collaboration with Selah Freedom, First Step Detox Center, the Sarasota Police Department and the Florida State Attorney's Office.

TYLA has enabled the legal system to help survivors receive restorative care in lieu of jail time, shedding light on the fact that these women are the victims - not the perpetrators.



600 survivors were reached through Outreach.

Residential

75% of survivors who come through our Residential Program do not return to the streets.













Survivors in our Residential Program receive a personalized education plan, medical and legal aid, nutrition, trauma therapy, horse therapy, art therapy, job placement, mentorship, life skills training and, most of all, freedom! They are restored so they can discover their gifts and embrace their future!

When asked what their dreams are for the future, survivors in our Residential Program said they want to own their own business, go to school for criminal justice, and help women like themselves understand there is hope for a better future!

44 survivors were reached through Residential.

Reuniting Families

The lives of survivors are not the only ones being restored through our programs. Thanks to your support, we are able to reunite mothers to their children and teach them how to build a healthy relationship with them. Our work with survivors is breaking the generational cycle of sexual exploitation in families!

Reclaiming Dreams

Women in our programs learn to dream again. Selah Freedom equips them with the support and tools they need to pursue their educational and career goals. By pursuing their GED, college education and career goals, survivors are discovering their passions, purpose and gifts. Many are working towards degrees in criminal justice and social work so that they can become advocates for other survivors!

Restoring Survivors

It costs an average of \$40,000 per woman to incarcerate them. Prior to Selah Freedom partnering with and training law enforcement and legislators, survivors were often jailed for the very crimes they were actually victims of their traffickers. By offering them restoration and addressing their root issues within our Outreach and Residential Programs, Selah Freedom saves the state money that otherwise would have been used to incarcerate these women.

Recognizing Needs

The women we serve do not typically realize they are survivors of sex trafficking. Selah Freedom works with women to help them recognize they were forced into things they never would have chosen themselves if they were given the opportunities in life they truly deserve - they are not to blame for their abuse. Once they understand this, we are able to help them move forward into recovery and freedom.



48 children have been reunited with their mother.

35 survivors have pursued their educational and career goals.

Selah Freedom has saved the state \$1.8 million by restoring survivors through our Outreach and Residential Programs as opposed to them being incarcerated.

806 survivors have realized they were being trafficked and received help through Selah Freedom.

We have partnered with the University of South Florida to collect research and data and look forward to bringing you more in-depth statistics, outcomes and measurements of our work with survivors of sex trafficking in 2017.

Outcomes reported are from 2015.

Awareness

Selah Freedom's Awareness Program educates law enforcement, non-profit organizations, business professionals, parents, students and the faith community through our Speakers Bureau, at Community Booths, and by providing CSEC 101 Training (Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children). This year, we identified and trained over 300 volunteers to work in these programs.

Capital Improvement

Thanks to \$50,000 from The Globally Free Foundation and \$150,000 from an anonymous donor, we are able to kick off the first phase of our Capital Campaign by adding a duplex to our Residential Campus, creating additional bedrooms for survivors. We also completed the installation of a security fence on our property through the contributions of an anonymous donor and Abundant Life Church.


We are now moving onto the second phase of capital expansion through a barn renovation project. We are grateful to the anonymous donors who have launched this phase. \$85,000 of the \$200,000 has been raised for this project. These generous donors have deemed the barn as "Julie's Place" in honor of a special friend and counselor with a heart for survivors. We are transforming the barn into a multi-room center with space for activities, education, fitness, counseling, meetings, and more. Here are a few words about Julie's Place from our champions.



Selah Freedom is excited to bring solutions to the Midwest area! There is a desperate need for residential programming for 18+ survivors of sex trafficking and exploitation in this region. Selah Freedom will bring solutions through safe housing and awareness and by strengthening collaborations to bring regionally sustainable solutions. Selah Freedom is partnering with CAASE and The Sunlight Project at 4th Presbyterian Church, and many others to lay a solid foundation for what will revolutionize the lives of survivors!

Selah Freedom is partnering with a Global Business expansion expert to solidly and strategically launch into the Midwest. In addition to overseeing the Expansion Business Plan, he has also provided a \$140,000 matching gift thanks to Elizabeth Moore and the Moore Family Foundation. This gift was 100% matched in 2016! The expansion plan also calls for Elizabeth Fisher, our President/CEO to be in the market every month bringing the Selah Freedom vision and DNA. Lead Florida staff will also provide the foundational covering to our Midwest staff/market to strongly establish Selah Freedom Midwest. Selah Freedom's expansion policy is a very in-depth process of ensuring that our DNA be fully instilled into every market that we launch. Newly hired employees are brought to our headquarters to live for 60-90 days for full immersion ensuring the true duplication of our programs. All is executed with the highest level of excellence for the best outcomes and measurements.

We are also expanding throughout the Midwest, as an 11 bedroom home in Wisconsin has also been identified and we are currently raising funds to launch this home in the future. The Chicago-Milwaukee corridor is a major circuit for sex trafficking, so our presence here will save lives!

It is out vision is to be the nationally recognized organization for fighting domestic sex trafficking. As we restore survivors, prevent teens from being exploited, and educate the public on this issue, we know that we can bring an end to sex trafficking forever.




TOTAL REVENUE FY 2015
